Hand, Foot and Mouth	None as long as child is well
Headlice	None as longs as treatment has started
Impetigo	Until lesions are crusted and healed, or 48 hours
	after commencing antibiotic treatment
Measles and German Measles (Rubella)	Four days from onset of rash
Mumps	None
Meningitis	Until recovered
Ringworm	Exclusion not usually required, but treatment
	required
Slapped cheek	None once rash has developed
Scarlet fever	Child can return 24 hours after commencing
	appropriate antibiotic treatment
Strep A	until they no longer have a fever and have taken
	antibiotics for at least 12 hours.
Shingles	Exclude only if rash is weeping and cannot be
	covered
Scabies	Child can return after first treatment. Household
	and close contacts require treatment
Tonsillitis	None – No Temp and well within themselves
Threadworms	None
Vomiting and/or Diarrhoea	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting
Warts/ Verrucae	None
Whooping cough	48 hours from commencing antibiotic treatment, or
	21 days from onset of illness if no antibiotic
